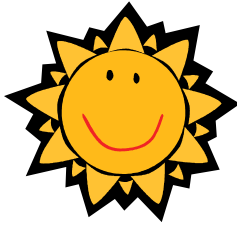

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Devotional by **Don Schwager**
Hebrews 11:30-40e

The author to the Hebrews ends his praise of great heroes by telling us what these men and women of faith did in the name of God. His audience would have been very familiar with the biblical stories surrounding the themes he mentions. Daniel stopped the mouths of lions-Daniel 6:23. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego escaped unharmed from the fiery furnace-Daniel.3:19-28. The prophets Elijah and Elisha escaped destruction by the sword (1Kings.19:1ff, 2Kings.6:31ff) Judith saved her people from destruction when she single-handedly cut the head of Holofernes and threw his army into panic. All these examples serve as a reminder of what God had accomplished in the past through men and women of faith. They remind us that God is still at work today, ready to fight for us against the spiritual forces that would destroy both body and soul in hell. When we acknowledge our own weakness and sinfulness, then we are on the right path to true humility and greatness in the kingdom of God. Heroes of the faith were men and women just like us. They struggled with temptation and testing, with doubt and hopeless causes. They found strength and hope to overcome all odds in one source alone -- in God who never abandons those who trust in him. What made them great was not their natural gifts, talents, wits or resources. It was their whole-hearted trust in God and in the power of his kingdom. They believed against great odds in the God who is faithful to all his promises. They never wavered in hope even when there was no cause for human hope, because their hope was in God.
